High school basketball teams across Ohio will encourage their fellow students to volunteer in their communities during this time, and the team that achieves the highest percentage of school participation will be recognized at a Cleveland Cavaliers Basketball game and meet with NBA all-star, Shaquille O'Neal.

HOW TO WIN:

- Member schools complete the normal application process for OHSAA Foundation Service Week at www.ugive.org, as outlined in the 2009 Participation Packet.
- Encourage ALL students (not just those on the basketball team) to sign up for the volunteer event / service project you post at www.ugive.org.
- The winning school will be the school which has the highest **PERCENTAGE** of students who volunteer **AND have those hours confirmed on www.ugive.org** - Questions on how students register for the project can be directed to info@ugive.org

WHAT YOU WIN:

- The school which gets the highest PERCENTAGE of students to sign up and volunteer for a project during OHSAA Service Week (Nov. 19 – Dec. 5), will win the following:
 - 18 Tickets to a Cleveland Cavaliers Game
 - Private Meeting with "Shaq"
- Date of game will be Sunday, January 31st.

RULES/RESTRICTIONS:

- Only volunteers registered on www.ugive.org will be counted in the tally to determine the winner. Any volunteers documented offline and/or provided in reports to the OHSAA Foundation will not be considered for this contest.
- Contest is focused on service/volunteering. Hours put towards fundraising and/or the amount collected as part of a fundraiser will not be considered. While the OHSAA Foundation is supportive of fundraising efforts and applauds those efforts, for this particular contest/incentive, only volunteer hours are considered.
- Only 18 tickets will be available for the contest winner. Schools with multiple teams participating in Service Week will be able to determine which students get to participate in the contest prize.
